Job Title: ADAPTED PHYSICAL EDUCATION SPECIALIST

Definition:

Under the supervision of the site administrator, with support from Student Services, the Adapted Physical Education Specialist is a member of the special education instructional team and is directly involved with teaching children with special needs. Teachers who hold the CA Education Specialist Instruction Credential: Adapted Physical Education are qualified to teach all students who are in a special education placement in the Antelope Valley SELPA, Preschool-12th grade, including any student eligible for DIS Adapted Physical Education as mandated by their Individual Education Plan.

Essential Job Duties:

The following tasks are essential for this position. Incumbents in this classification may not perform all of these tasks, or may perform similar related tasks not listed here.

- 1. Identifies motor deficits in students by screening and referrals.
- 2. Assesses physical and perceptual-motor problems and formulates prognosis.
- 3. Establishes case load and school schedules.
- 4. Formulates goals and objectives within individual education plan for each identified child.
- 5. Instructs students in the following areas:

Gross-motor and object control skills, including coordination training.

Improvement of health and physical fitness.

Development of positive self-image and social skills.

Increased interest in individual and group recreational activities.

Enhancement of language and cognitive development.

- 6. Maintains adequate records and progress reports on each child.
- 7. Provides an evaluation to determine if objectives of the child have been met.
- 8. Submits necessary reports and schedules to the Director of Student Services or designee.
- 9. Provides information and consults with administrators, teachers, and parents regarding children with physical or perceptual-motor problems.
- 10. Develops integration activities for students with special needs in regular physical education classes.
- 11. Provides information of community resources available for physical or perceptual-motor handicapped pupils.
- 12. Provides in-service and consultation to District staff in the area of physical education if needed.
- 13. Orders necessary supplies and equipment.
- 14. Develops and implements District physical education plans.
- 15. Arranges for facility use and equipment based on student needs.
- 16. Other duties as assigned.

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Minimum Knowledge, Skill and Ability:

Knowledge of:

- Computer programs and related software
- Anatomy and Physiology as it applies to motor development
- Sequential development of acquired motor skills and child development
- Criteria for eligibility to receive special education services
- California State framework of adapted physical education.
- Development of individual education plans.

Skill and Ability to:

- Appearance, grooming personality which establish a desirable example for students.
- Understand and cope with emotional problems of students and parents which may accompany physical handicaps.
- Work harmoniously with school/District personnel, parents, students, supervisors, and departments.
- Successfully implement individual educational plans for students needing adapted physical education.
- Inform community and school of all available resources for the physically handicapped.
- Initiate and follow through referrals concerning students with physical or perceptualmotor problems.
- To participate in District program development in physical education.
- To prepare and implement District programs in physical education.
- Maintain professional confidentiality

Training and Experience

- Physical education credential
- Adapted Physical Education Specialist Credential
- Bachelor's degree in Physical Education or Kinesiology
- A minimum of three (3) years successful teaching experience in a K-8 program
- Demonstrated effective leadership involving increasing levels of responsibility
- Current First Aid/CPR Certificate

Physical Requirements and Working Conditions:

- Require vision (which may be corrected) to read small print.
- Require the mobility to stand, stoop, reach and bend. Require mobility of arms to reach and dexterity of hands to grasp and manipulate small objects.
- Is subject to inside and outside environmental conditions
- May be required to take and pass a physical examination
- Will be required to have live scan fingerprinting completed and cleared prior to beginning work
- Must have a valid California driver's license and be insurable
- Utilize own vehicle for transportation as needed
